Jeremiah 20:8-10



THE JOY OF PRAISING HIM

"Sing for joy in the Lord, O you righteous ones; praise is becoming to the upright" (Psalm 33:1).

"But you are a chosen race, a royal priesthood, a holy nation, a people for God's own possession, so that you may proclaim the excellencies of Him who has called you out of darkness into His marvelous light." (1 Peter 2:9b).

The Christian should be adept at praising God. This high and holy activity should be normal with us. From the first verse of Psalm 33 and from 1 Peter 2:9, we see the nature of praising the Lord.

The praise of God is an expression of gratitude. Praise is an overflow and outflow of thanksgiving. We celebrate thanksgiving in America, but many families do not know whom to thank. The Christian does.

The praise of God should naturally emerge from joy. The happiness God has given us should express itself in extolling Him. Worship is to be a joyous occasion, with worshipers gathering to sing with happy hearts filled with gratefulness.

The praise of God should be given by the people of God. Praise of God is a family trait. The desire to give thanks to God rises up daily in the hearts of His redeemed people. God is a righteous God, and He wants His righteous ones, the ones made righteous by His Son's blood, to worship Him (see Isaiah 6:4, 5).

The praise of God should be a recurring theme. We sing a new song each time we come together because we have new reasons to praise our God. In 1 John 2:7, John said that he was writing about the command to love one another, an old commandment that had become new. It was old in age but new in quality. Jesus had made it new because He had shown His disciples how to exhibit it. So it is with praise. God's recent mercy gives us a reason to add new songs of praise to our worship. We may sing an old song, but we sing it in a new way or with new meaning.

The Christian is motivated regularly to lift up his heart in praise to God. He is constrained by his joys, his redeemed life, the recurring mercies of God, the precious Word of God, and the gratitude of his heart for all that God has done. Let us eagerly respond to every impulse to praise our Father, pouring out before His throne the love for God that we have in our hearts.

"Who can speak of the mighty deeds of the Lord, or can show forth all His praise?" (Psalm 106:2).
