Answer D

"Praise Without Ceasing"

"Through Him then, let us continually offer up a sacrifice of praise to God, that is the fruit of lips that give thanks to His name" (Hebrews 13:15)

Praise, by definition, is giving thanks to God for what He has done. One wonderful message in these two verses is that continual praise is part of the life of the believer. We know what God has done for us in the past, and we are confident of what He will do for us tomorrow; therefore, we joyfully extol Him and give thanks to Him.

The "always" of spirituality is found three times in 1 Thessalonians 5: "Rejoice always"; "Pray without ceasing"; and "In everything give thanks" (1Thess 5:16-18a). Implied in these three injunctions is a fourth: "Praise Him without ceasing."

As we begin a season of praising our Father and His Son, Jesus let us commit ourselves to three great praise resolutions.

The first resolution; "We will remember to praise Him." We will not receive His gifts and go on our way without expressing adoration and thanksgiving to Him. Whatever we may face, we will have one resolve firmly settled in our hearts: We will give thanks to Him. Praise is never out of place. Even when we are in a smog of confusion, we will praise Him for all that he has done.

The second resolution: "We will commit ourselves to praising him continually." Our praise will not be spasmodic and once-in-a-while; it will be perennial, ever new, and continually flowing upward and outward. Don't let yourself talk to you; you talk to yourself. With a resolute commitment, say to your heart, "The praise of God will be the pattern of my life. It will be a constant attitude that I will seek to maintain."

The third resolution: "We will resolve to teach others to praise Him." We will pass this sweet spirit of praise on to the generations that will follow us. Our joyous praise of God will go up to Him and our to others, for we will teach our children and our neighbors to praise God. We have learned in our spiritual journey that one way to tell whether or not we have succeeded with our families is to ask ourselves, "Are our children praising God?" If they are, we have been a success; if they are not, we have failed. All other standards of measuring human achievement are faulty.

In times of great joy and in crumbled ruins of disaster, we will praise the God of our salvation. In whatever situation we find ourselves, we will lift up our voices to him in thanksgiving. Nothing, not even the greatest of all tragedies, will be allowed to interrupt our blessing His name and giving adoration to God our Father and Jesus His Son.

When we think of gratitude in the life of the Christian, two words come to mind: "praise" and "persistence." Christians are aware of how dependent on God they are, and they express their understanding of this undeniable fact in their daily and public thanksgiving to Him.

We cannot praise Him continuously, but we can praise Him continually. So, come, let us magnify the Lord together.


