

All Things Work Together for Good

Romans 8:31-39

At the beginning of the book of Romans, Paul painted this picture of mankind being enemies with God. All that existed was anger on the part of God. That anger was ready to be revealed on all of mankind. The anger was just and appropriate because the world is corrupt. It is not that there are not people in the world that are trying to be good people, but that it is impossible to be good when we sin. Forgiveness is the only way that a sinner can be good. This is justification through faith according to the grace of God. Once the individual is cleansed of his sin, he is no longer an enemy with God, but rather, God is on his side. The difficulty of life, both because of personal struggle and external struggle, is now made possible to endure because God is on our side. The evidence that God is on our side is seen in the fact that He sent His Son, delivered Him up, so that we might be delivered.

The result of this salvation is defense against any accusation. The defense is not to avoid worldly consequence, but to rest assured of an eternal deliverance. There is no one that can condemn what God has saved. We obviously can refuse that deliverance, but we have eternal protection if we hold on to God. Another way to put it, if we hold on to God, then God will hold on to us. Jesus continually petitions our innocence at the throne of God.

The book of Job shows us an accusation scene where the Devil tries to accuse Job of cursing God if God allowed Job's blessings to be removed. The rest of the book is about Job's friends accusing him of sin even though he is innocent of sin. The book of Job is a perfect illustration of how nothing can separate you from the love of God if you do not allow it. This includes any degree of earthly suffering, whether internal or external.

Paul makes a list of things that cannot separate us from God's love: tribulation, stress, persecution, hunger, nakedness, danger, and sword. Notice the wide range of application in this list: if you are facing pain, whether physical or emotional; if someone is causing your pain, whether physical or emotional; if something or someone is threatening your life; if something or someone is going to take your life. It may remind us of the "side effects may include..." part of a drug commercial. It is obvious

Paul is not promising a comfortable life as a Christian. Instead, what he is promising is a fuller life as a Christian.

No matter what you are going through, life is better with eternal assurance in Christ. It does not make difficulties in life easy, but we are never alone. We know that God will deliver us because He delivered His Son, and no one can take away that deliverance because we are justified in Christ. This is what it means that "all things work together for good to those who love God" (8:28); not that life will be comfortable, but God will redeem us from our discomfort when this life is through. And until then, we have God on our side, and we have our church family.
