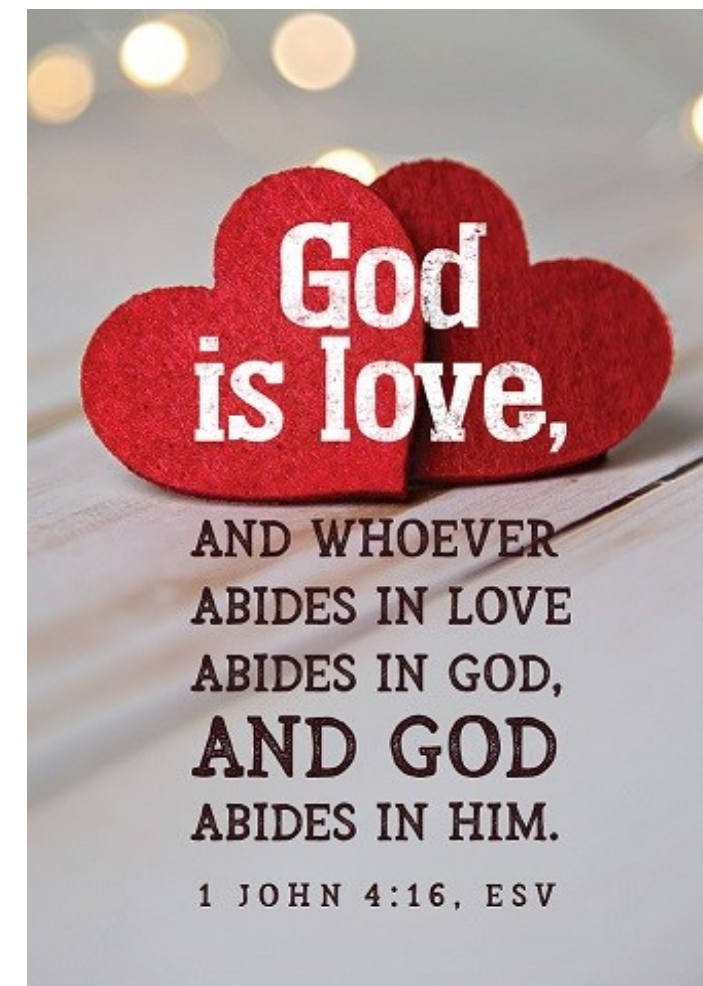

Losing a Brother

Acts 12

John was one of the, if not the longest living apostle in the New Testament. Apparently, his life was so long that some had developed a theory that he would never die (John 21:23). He wrote the gospel, the three epistles, and the book of Revelation. In Revelation 6, he says, "When He opened the fifth seal, I saw under the altar the souls of those who had been slain for the word of God and for the testimony which they held. And they cried with a loud voice, 'How long, O Lord, holy and true, until You judge and avenge our blood on those who dwell on the earth?'" (6:9-10).

Today, everyone knows someone who has dealt with or is dealing with cancer. In the first century, if you were a Christian, it was probably true to say that everyone knew someone who had died for the word of God.

In Acts 12, John's brother died for the word of God and the testimony which he held. Herod the king was persecuting the church because he saw that the Jews liked it. It reminds me of John the Baptist's beheading. There, John was beheaded just because Herod promised his daughter that he would do whatever she asked. This is a petty reason to take someone's life. Now John the Apostle must live the rest of his long life believing that James had died for a noble cause.

In Matthew 20, the mother of James and John approached Jesus and asked Him to cause her sons to sit on the right hand and left hand of Jesus. Jesus responded that they did know what they were asking. They would drink the cup of

Christ and be baptized with the baptism which He would be baptized with, but it was not His to grant the place to sit in the kingdom. Needless to say, the other disciples were not too happy about this request. The irony of this was that James was the first to die for the cause of Christ, and John was the last. James was respected for his example, and John was respected for his years of teaching. Both gave their lives for the word of Christ and the testimony.

I have always wondered if John, in Revelation 6, saw his brother. If not then, I believe he sees him now.

"Behold what manner of love the Father has bestowed on us, that we should be called children of God! Therefore the world does not know us, because it did not know Him. Beloved, now we are children of God; and it has not yet been revealed what we shall be, but we know that when He is revealed, we shall be like Him, for we shall see Him as He is. And everyone who has this hope in Him purifies himself, just as He is pure" (1 John 3:1-3).
